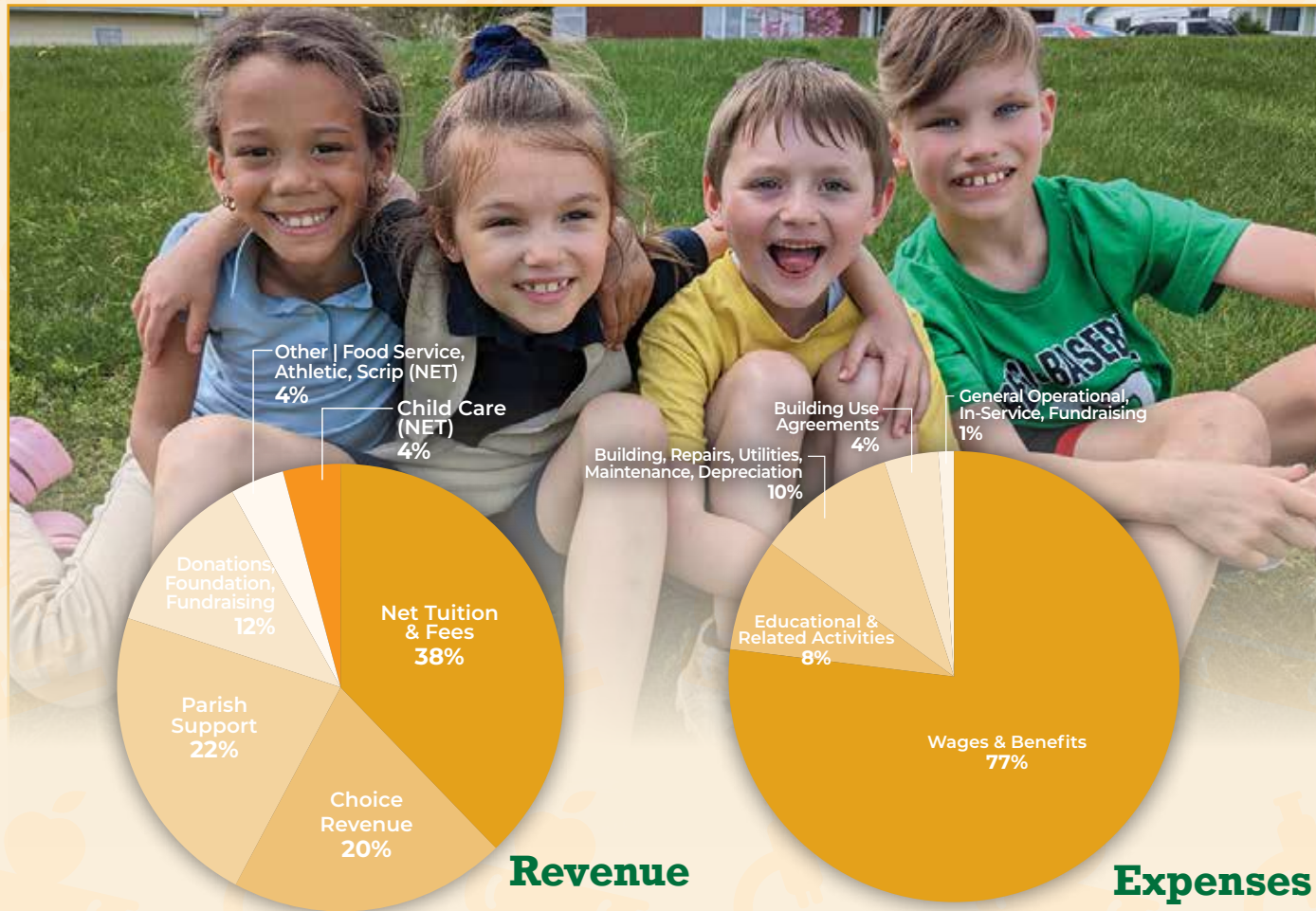

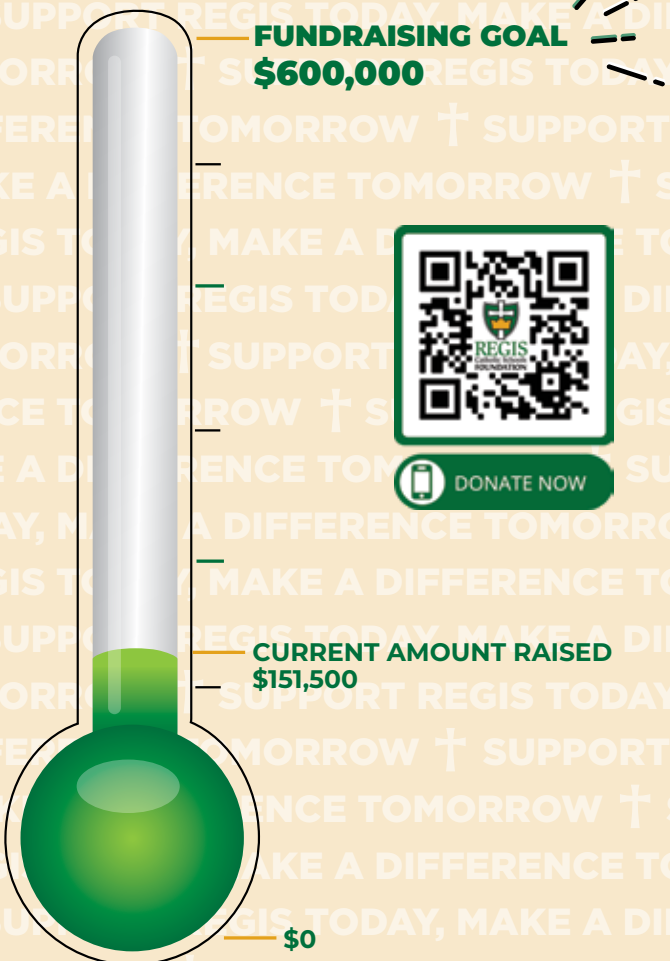

**Completed in 1953**, the current Regis Middle School and Regis High School building was starting to show its age, especially on the second floor of the facility. Knowing this, the Regis Catholic Schools Foundation stepped in to get the ball rolling on a major renovation project.

“This project was a collaborative response by our school administration and the Regis Catholic Schools Foundation to provide our students with the best educational setting possible,” said President Paul Pedersen ‘89. “The second floor of the Regis campus primarily houses our middle school classrooms, but also houses some high school classrooms, our student resource areas, and the school library. No renovations of this magnitude have been completed since the construction of the Regis campus back in the 1950s.”

After receiving support from Fr. James Kurzynski and the priests within the Eau Claire Deanery, the renovation process began in June of 2023, with students and staff coming together to empty the entire second floor of the building. Area crews and community partners then got to work upgrading almost every aspect of the space; removing asbestos, replacing flooring, painting the walls, upgrading ceilings and lighting, adding new energy-efficient window coverings, and installing new lockers for the middle school students.

“We had to get creative with certain aspects of the project due to the age of the building,” President Pedersen said. “A lot of credit goes to Hoeft Builders Inc. for taking the lead and making it all happen.”

While these changes are physical, Regis Middle School and Regis High School Principal Christi Machler knows they will ultimately lead to a better learning experience for the system’s current and future students.

“An updated school facility provides a conducive environment for learning and can improve morale among students and staff,” Machler said. “Comfortable, bright, and clean classrooms contribute to better student focus and concentration. These upgrades also create a sense of pride and belonging that positively impacts the school’s culture.”

As with many projects, this upgrade would not have been possible without the generous support of donors who value the importance of a Catholic education.

“The Regis Catholic Schools Foundation is comprised of a dedicated board of nine members whose mission is to establish and grow a sustainable fund that flourishes through investments and the support of our donors,” said Mark Beckfield, President of the Regis Catholic

Fr. Kurzynski added that he sees this project as not only a newly renovated space for students on the Regis campus but as a statement of commitment to Catholic education.

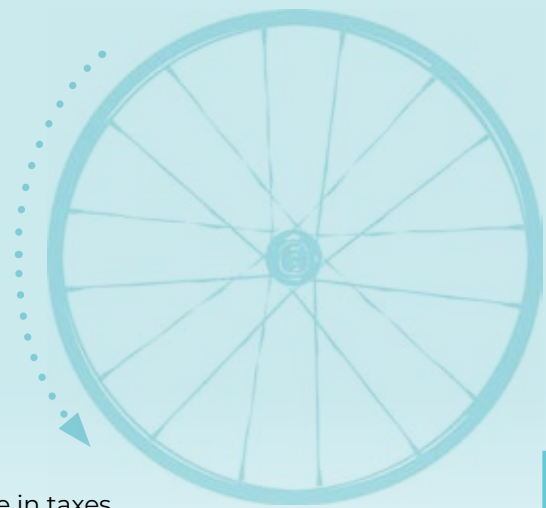

The Running Ramblers began their season on August 14, 2023. The first few weeks of pre-season included training sessions at Lowe's Creek Park, the soccer park, the UW-Eau Claire track, the YMCA pool, and Putnam Trail. Throughout the season, the team trained at South Middle School, the soccer park, and the streets around Regis High School. A favorite run was downtown to cool off in the splash pad at the Pablo Center! This team knew how to work hard and have fun!

The girls' team had a target on its back as the 2022 Cloverbelt Conference and WIAA Sectional Champions. Since depth is not a trademark of this Regis team, a top-five injured runner precluded a repeat for the Cloverbelt title, but a full squad at WIAA Sectionals ran to another title! There are two graduating senior girls: Ava Highman who debuted this season and rounded out our top five and Ava Moore who was a four-year runner and progressed from 24+ minutes to a 20:48 minute 5K. Ava Moore was a second-year team captain and her leadership will be missed. Carly Borst qualified for the WIAA State Tournament meet for the third straight year and had a lifetime best of 20:17.9 at the state meet. Sylvia Spangler ran strong all season and had a lifetime best of 20:31. The only new freshman team member was Kaylen Borst who proved to be an asset to the team's success. Juniors Rebecca Catt and Grace Market both ran lifetime bests this season; their second season on the team. The girls ran on October 28, 2023 at the state meet and placed 13/16 teams.

The boy's team had three returners and three freshmen. This young team kept improving all season and was led by Dominic Santine. Dominic, a sophomore, had a season best of 17:26 at the WIAA Sectional meet which earned him a spot at the big dance in Wisconsin Rapids! He placed 81st and ran 18:12 at the state meet.
